We encourage all Year 6 families to save the date for our upcoming Year 6 graduation ceremony.


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This will be a fantastic opportunity to celebrate students past 7 years of schooling so we hope to see everyone there!

# 9) GET ACTIVE KIDS PROGRAM

We're excited to announce that Round 8 of the Get Active Kids Voucher Program is now open!

Round 8 is open for voucher and reimbursement applications from Wednesday 9 October 2024, until the funding allocation runs out. Eligible families can apply for either a \$200 voucher or reimbursement for each eligible child.

To be eligible, your child/dependent must be:

- a Victorian resident
- aged 0 to 18 years old
- named on a Health Care Card and Medicare Card, or

named on a Pensioner Concession Card and Medicare Card.

Special consideration may apply if your child/dependent is a Victorian resident, aged zero to 18 years old and is currently residing in Victorian Care Services or a temporary visa holder, undocumented migrant or international student.

### How do I use my voucher?

Present your voucher code to your activity provider when you pay and get up to \$200 off the cost of registration and membership (as well as any included uniforms and equipment). Choose your activity provider carefully as there are no cancellations for change of mind. Apply for a voucher while the round is open and use it for a summer sport, winter sport or term-based activity until vouchers expire on Tuesday 29 April 2025.

Dear parents and carers,

In Term 4, 2024, families with a child enrolled in a government school from Prep to Year 12 in 2025 will receive the one-off \$400 School Saving Bonus.

The \$400 School Saving Bonus provides families with support for educationrelated costs, such as school activities and/or school uniforms and textbooks.

The School Saving Bonus is not available for full-fee international students, home schooled students, TAFE students and students attending kindergarten in 2025.

### Actions for parents and carers:

Before 18 October 2024, the Department of Education is asking parents and carers to:

Complete enrolment: If your child, or children are changing government school for Term 1 2025, or starting Prep or Year 7 in 2025. For more information, read about Enrolling in School.

- Check your contact information: Ensure your email address and phone number is up to date with us. You can check this information by contacting us directly.

We need to ensure your contact information is up to date as the Department of Education will email you twice:

- in October, to verify your email address

- in November, with your \$400 School Saving Bonus and access to an online system.

Please check your junk mail regularly to make sure you do not miss an important email.

### **Monash University BIO-Eyes Incursion**

LIFELONG LEARNING

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On Thusday 17th of October a group of students were invited to a Monash University program for high ability students to examine a type of fish called a Zebra fish.
We learned about how Zebra fish get pregnant with a male and how the eggs are made and what they look like.
We also looked at baby fishes and used a microscope to look inside of it - we could do that because of it being transparent. We learned lots of fun facts about Zebra fishes.
We worked in groups of 3 to 4 and discovered their body parts and how the baby fishes grow.

At the end we did questions from the start of the lesson and tried to answer using everything we learnt. We think that the program is a fun way to learn about biomedical science.


